

Daniel Stabile Discusses Rise of Miami's Blockchain Technology Scene

The *Miami Herald* reports that Miami will be hosting Bitcoin 2021, arguably the largest cryptocurrency conference in the world, signaling the city's "emergence as a center for crypto and blockchain technology."

Daniel Stabile, a partner in Shutts & Bowen's Miami office, characterized the conference's move to Miami as "a signifier . . . that the industry is recognizing Miami as an epicenter for blockchain technology."

Daniel believes that the most significant aspect of blockchain technology is its removal of the need for a trusted third party to carry out transactions.

"In the future, I think that blockchain technology will play an increasingly important role in our lives — maybe not in the foreground but in the background," Daniel told the *Miami Herald*. "We'll have to wait and see what the dominant use cases are in five, 10, 15 years, but I'm very confident that blockchain technology will feature increasingly prominently in our everyday lives as time goes on."
